Similarly, the Round Table Conference on Homeland Security, organised by the Centre for National Security Studies in collaboration with international partners, reflected the university's growing engagement with strategic, technology-driven domains aligned with national priorities.

Inauguration of the Sleep Lab



The Department of Respiratory Medicine, Ramaiah Medical College and Hospital (RMCH), inaugurated a state-of-the-art Sleep Laboratory on 5th December, 2025, marking a significant milestone in the diagnosis and management of sleep-related disorders.

The Sleep Lab was inaugurated by Dr. M. R. Jayaram, Chairman, Gokula Education Foundation (Medical) & Chancellor, RUAS, Dr. Shalini C. Nooyi, Principal and Dean, RMCH, Dr. Ramesh D., Associate Dean, RMCH, Maj. (Dr.) Shivakumar Hiremath, Director (Operations), RMCH, along with faculty members from the Department of Respiratory Medicine.

The newly inaugurated facility is a Level 1 Polysomnography Laboratory equipped to comprehensively evaluate sleep disorders such as obstructive sleep apnea, central sleep apnea, parasomnias, hypersomnolence disorders, and other sleep-related breathing disorders. The laboratory has the capacity to perform one full

polysomnography study per day, enabling it to cater to a significant patient population and meet the growing clinical demand for sleep medicine services.

Following the inauguration, a Continuing Medical Education (CME) programme was conducted to highlight the importance of sleep health and interdisciplinary collaboration. Dr. Uma Maheshwari Krishnaswamy, MD, DM, Fellow in Sleep Disorders, was the Guest of Honour and delivered an enlightening address on the science of sleep, its disorders, and their impact on overall health and quality of life.

The establishment of the Sleep Lab opens new avenues for clinical services, postgraduate training, and high-quality research in sleep medicine. It is expected to significantly contribute to patient care, academic enrichment, and evidence-based research at Ramaiah Medical College, further strengthening its role as a tertiary care teaching hospital.



The Centre for National Security Studies (CNSS), in collaboration with the Israel Trade and Economic Mission to South India, organised an invite-only Round Table Conference on "Homeland Security: Innovation and Collaboration Opportunities" on 8th December, 2025.

The conference brought together senior stakeholders from Indian industry, the Armed

The hackathon lasted up to 36 hours and featured team interactions, mentoring sessions, and solution-development activities. This national-level competition aims to foster innovation and entrepreneurship among students by encouraging them to identify and solve pressing societal challenges and transform their ideas into implementable solutions.

The landscape of hematological care at Ramaiah Medical College reached an international pinnacle this November with the successful hosting of the WBMT Symposium on Cell Therapy. In a landmark collaboration, the Worldwide Network for Blood and Marrow Transplantation (WBMT) and Ramaiah Medical College co-hosted this scientific convention the event united global experts to discuss the rapidly evolving paradigm of Chimeric Antigen Receptor (CAR) T-cell therapies and hematopoietic cell transplantation (HCT).

The symposium was inaugurated with a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony and the Ramaiah Anthem, attracting significant media attention. The event was graced by Chief Guest Sri K. B. Sivakumar, IAS, Commissioner of Health and Family Welfare Services, Karnataka, who emphasized the importance of accessible advanced therapies. The institutional leadership was represented in full strength, including Dr. Nagendra Swamy, CE, Health Care Services, GEF, Dr. Madan Gaikwad, COO of Ramaiah Memorial Hospital, Dr. Kuldeep Kumar Raina, Vice Chancellor of RUAS, and

The scientific sessions bridged the gap between global perspectives and local implementation, led by local organizing chair Dr. Santhosh K. Devadas. Key international faculty included WBMT President Dr. Damiano Rondelli (USA), Vice-President Dr. Mickey Koh (UK/Singapore), and the distinguished Dr. Anna Sureda (Spain), who provided invaluable insights into B-cell lymphomas. National stalwarts such as Dr. Vikram Mathews and Dr. Hasmukh Jain discussed the essential clinical frameworks for establishing indigenous CAR-T programs.

A high-spirited Student Quiz, moderated by Dr. Uday Kulkarni and others, engaged the academic community, culminating in an award ceremony led by the RUAS Provost, Dr. G. S. Venkatesh. As a global NGO in official relations with the WHO, the WBMT's partnership with Ramaiah underscores our institution's growing influence in specialized medical research and its commitment to providing state-of-the-art, equitable access to life-saving treatments.

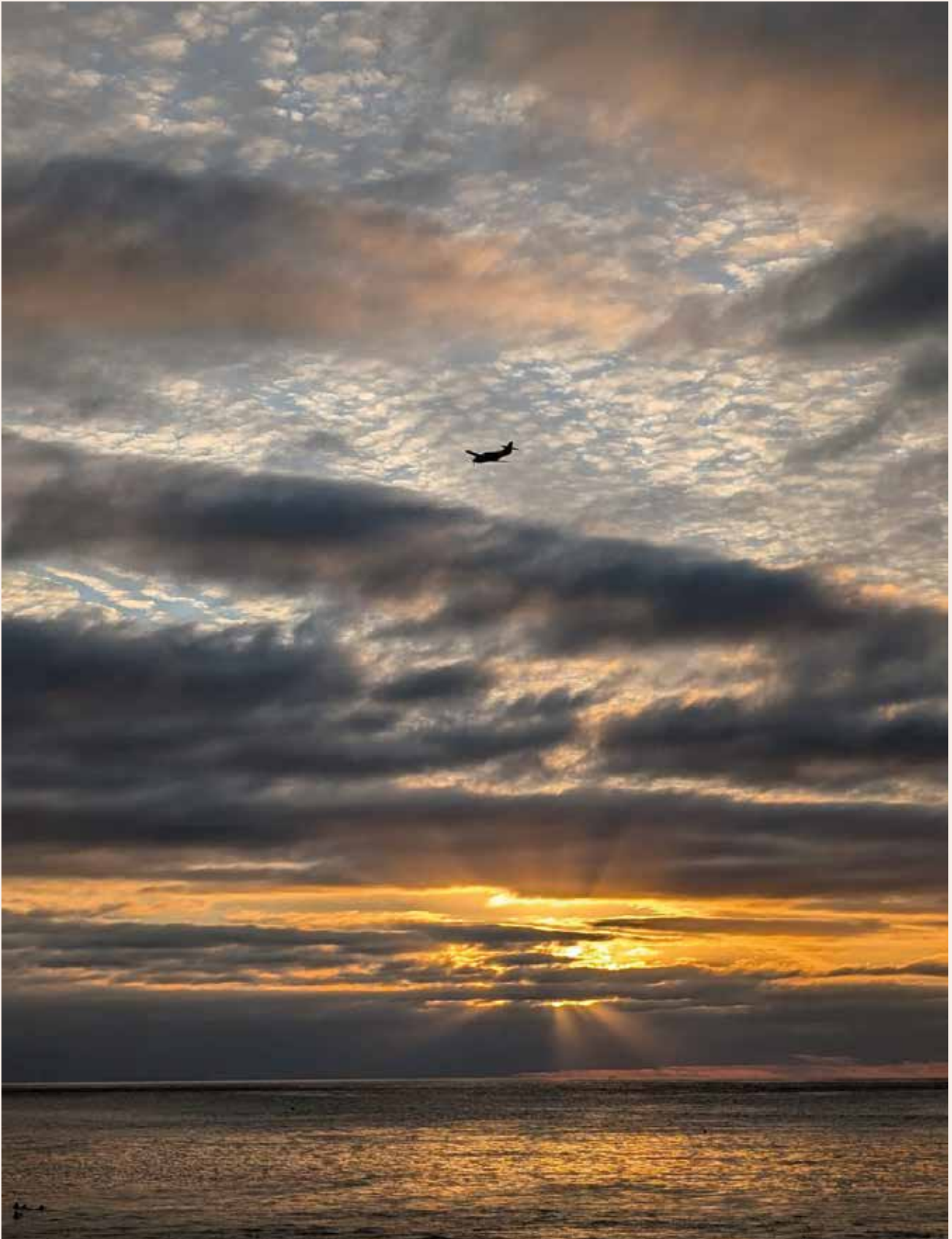
