

ACTIVITIES OF THE INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS OFFICE

- International student exchange programmes are organized by Ramaiah Medical College & Hospitals for students to explore the opportunities to attend summer schools, research collaborations and overseas clinical training such as electives/ observerships.
- International relations office publicizes the information on the college website regarding the availability of medical electives for the observership programs including Ayurveda & Physiotherapy.
- Information regarding the eligibility criteria, application, registration process, invite letters for visa processing, duration of observership, facility of lodging & transportation, temporary ID card & library facilities on arrival to the campus are made available to the students.
- On the basis of the students learning objectives clinical rotations are framed into a well structured observership program with details of the Nodal coordinators designated as their mentor for the training program shared with the students.
- Students are instructed to maintain a log book and enter the day to day activities & get it
 authenticated by the mentor faculty.
- Student observers to make a presentation at the end of the program which is attended by the Principal & Dean, IRO, Nodal coordinators, respective Heads of the departments where the students have attended the observership program.
- At the end of the program the students need fill & submit a feedback form of their observership experience at RMCH to the IRO.
- A completion certificate if required by the student is presented at the end of the program.

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
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Ghent University - Observership Program: The Four medical students from Ghent University, who successfully completed their two months of Observership Program at Medical College & Hospitals.
